A Message from Mayor Reddington

This spring marks the completion of my second full year serving as the Town of Ocean View Mayor. I have found the time to be very rewarding and I have gained a great deal of insight into the operation of our local government. I am proud to say that the operations of our Town, as supported by the Mayor and Council and accomplished by our employees, are meeting challenges head on while making the best of opportunities to maintain, and whenever possible improve the quality of life in Ocean View. I can say without reservation that we can all be proud of the accomplishments of our Town over the past year! I will however share a few of the highlights, including the State of Delaware Accreditation of the Ocean View Police Department, including the following statement shared by the DE Police Accreditation Team, ... Ocean View Property Tax Information:

Your 2022 Ocean View Property Tax Statement is enclosed with this newsletter and reflects a 3 cent tax rate reduction as well as your new assessment value from the 2021 Full Town reassessment. We continue to offer a 1% discount if you pay your taxes early or by July 31, 2022. The final tax due date is August 31, 2022 after which a penalty of $1\frac{1}{2}$ % per month will be added to any unpaid The ambulance fee is not taxes. eligible for discount. If you have an escrow account for your tax payment this statement is for informational purposes only as your mortgage company should remit your taxes on your behalf. Please confirm with your mortgage company if you are not sure and notify us of any change of name or mailing address to ensure our ability to contact you. You can pay your taxes in the

Taking Care of Business... Reminders!

Voter Registration – you must register with the Town in order to vote in Town elections. Please contact our Administrative Office or simply download the form from our website and send or deliver it with a copy of your valid DE driver's license.

John West Park – Group use of our pavilion is available by registering to hold a picnic, family reunion, birthday celebrations, etc.! Certain dates may not be available in association with Town events and activities.

An Ocean View **Business License** is required if you provide services or do work within the Town Limits.

If you own property in Ocean View that you rent, you are required to apply for a **Rental License**. Rental properties are subject to a 5% Gross Receipts tax.

Building permits are required for all construction projects, repairs, additions, etc. and should be acquired <u>prior</u> to the start of the project.

Property maintenance, including the area between the property line and the roadway is the responsibility of the property owner. This includes grass and debris maintenance.

Pets are required to be on a leash and are not permitted to run at large. Be sure to clean up after your pets when walking them in our neighborhoods or along the walking trail at John West Park! Failure to do so may result in a fine.

Project Updates from the Office of Planning & Development

Construction of the first phase of sidewalk is underway on West Avenue. Sidewalks along the east side of West Avenue are being constructed between State Route 26 and Osprey Lane. This project also includes a completely reconstructed roadway with roadway drainage features, new sidewalk on Oakwood Avenue and new pavement markings for enhanced safety.

Design of two additional phases of sidewalk along Woodland Avenue is near completion. The first segment of sidewalk along Woodland Avenue between State Route 26 and Hudson Avenue will be completed this spring. This project consists of sidewalk along the west side of Woodland Avenue, a reconstructed Woodland Avenue to include roadway drainage and new pavement markings. The second segment of sidewalk will be constructed along the north side of Daisey Avenue, from Woodland Avenue to Central Avenue and along Central Avenue to the Assawoman Canal. This project will also include a reconstructed Daisey Avenue with geometric improvements at the intersection of Daisey Avenue and Central Avenue and drainage improvements at the intersection of Daisey Avenue. Construction is expected to commence in the fall of 2022.

Design of the final segment of sidewalk along Woodland Avenue will begin in May 2022. This segment will include sidewalks along the west side of Woodland Avenue, roadway reconstruction and new pavement markings.

Our FY 2023 paving cycle is scheduled to begin May 1st. Following the curb replacement on October Glory Avenue last year, a segment of October Glory Avenue between Sycamore Street and Willow Oak Avenue was paved. The remainder of October Glory Avenue between Sycamore Street and Magnolia Street will be paved this year.

ADA improvements in the Savannah's Landing Community are almost complete! Last year we were able to remove and replace 118 driveway aprons to bring then into compliance with current ADA standards. This year the Town will complete the remaining 72 locations.

The Country Village and Country Estates Drainage Project has been advertised for bid. The Town Manager will be accepting bids for the project on May 3, 2022. This project, which was delayed, is scheduled to commence in the fall of 2022.

Drainage improvements were completed last year along Mitchell Avenue between Sussex and Delaware Avenue.

Sidewalk and curb repairs were completed last year in the Avon Park Community.

The Fairway Village Community has been completed. The Town Engineer inspected the streets, and the town accepted the streets for future maintenance.

The Smithfield Community, substantially completed in 2017, was inspected by the Town Engineer and accepted for future maintenance.

Mosquito Season Is Here!

The mosquito control plan for Ocean View is comprised of two distinct operations including DNREC and the Ocean View Public Works staff that work to provide a comprehensive treatment plan. Treatment is contingent upon acceptable weather at the time of application. Larvae treatments have already begun, and weekly mosquito spraying will begin the end of May and continue until the end of September. Spraying will take place on Tuesday and Friday mornings between 2:30 and 6:00am.

Town of Ocean View American Rescue Plan Act Funds Provide Support to the Millville Volunteer Fire Company, Building Improvement Campaign!

On April 12th the Mayor and Council presented a check for \$100,000 to the Millville Volunteer Fire Company in support of its building improvement and expansion project! The Millville Volunteer Fire Company provides fire and ambulance service to the Town of Ocean View and the surrounding areas including Millville and unincorporated areas of Sussex County. These funds are expected to assist in making necessary improvements that will improve the fire company's ability to recruit and maintain dedicated members in the years ahead!



Lifelong Learning Opportunities - in Ocean View!

Through our partnership with the University of Delaware, fun learning opportunities are available locally. The University of Delaware's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) holds classes at the Ocean View Community Center on Mondays and Wednesdays during the fall and spring semesters. The programs cover topics like English Country Dance, Mah Jongg, history and watercolor. Fall classes start in September; spring classes start in February.

UD's OLLI program is designed as a learning cooperative for adults age 50-plus to take classes and socialize together with no grades or exams. Members just learn for the fun of it. In addition to Ocean View, OLLI classes are also offered online, as well as in Bridgeville, Dover and Lewes. There's something for everyone! OLLI has been holding Ocean View classes since 2014.

This summer, OLLI invites you to join them for a fun English Country Dance class that meets at Ocean View Community Center on Wednesday afternoons in July, as well as a wide variety of online classes, and classes meeting on-site in Lewes, like stained glass, card-making and history of the Pony Express. Social distancing and health protocols will be followed. The fee for summer OLLI membership is \$95, which includes unlimited online or in-person course registration.
