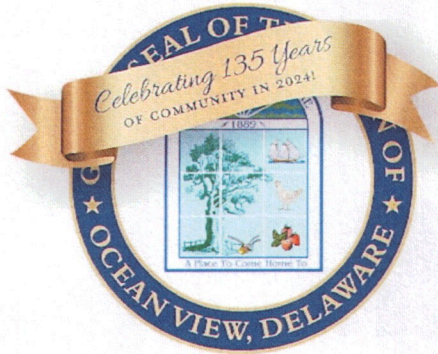

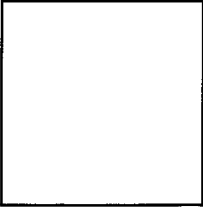

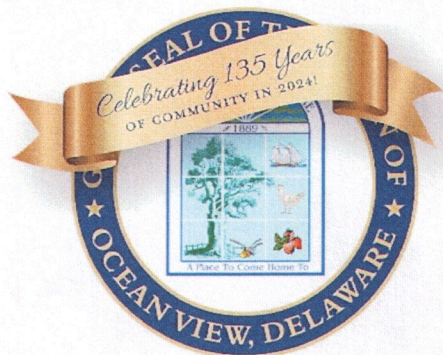
REPEAL THIS COUNCIL PEOPLE!. At the very least there should be a public referendum so that all of us in Ocean View can voice our opinion.

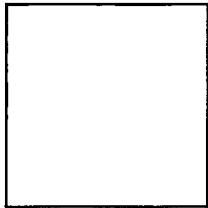

Question: By Rebecca Heath | NJ Advance Media for NJ.com A West Caldwell ordinance that would require demonstrators to pay in order to hold a protest in the township has prompted protests. The Township Council is slated to vote on the ordinance following a public hearing during its Tuesday meeting at 6:30 p.m. Under the proposed ordinance, organizers would need to apply for a permit from the township at least 30 days prior to holding a demonstration. They would also have to agree in writing to reimburse “any reasonable and foreseeable expenses incurred by the township,”

including security, setup and cleanup costs, according to the ordinance. Additionally, the ordinance would require organizers to secure \$2 million insurance coverage. The mayor, township administrator and others they designate would be charged with making the final decision on issuing permits, according to the ordinance. A letter published on Friday from ACLU – New Jersey urges the council to withdraw the ordinance from consideration, describing its policies as “glaringly unconstitutional.” The letter alleges that organizers would essentially have to hand over a “blank check,” allowing the township to charge for almost any expenses they deem necessary. The letter also states the application deadline, anticipated costs to obtain a permit and “excessive” insurance requirements could hinder people’s right to free speech. David Broderick, 67, of Rockaway Township, said he believes the ordinance is an effort to curtail protests in the township, which tends to have more demonstrations than other municipalities. He said organizers of the protests have expressed to the town council that they believe the ordinance would impose “unconstitutional and unwarranted infringements on their right to hold such demonstrations.” Broderick said he has attended two demonstrations in the township to protest President Donald Trump and his administration. Since the demonstrations were “peaceful and orderly,” he suspects the council is taking aim at political-based protests. “If that is the case, such an attempt to silence peaceful political speech is clearly both unconstitutional and un-American,” he said. Broderick said he expects there to be “vociferous opposition” expressed at Tuesday’s council meeting. The township mayor and council members did not return requests from NJ Advance Media for comment Tuesday afternoon.

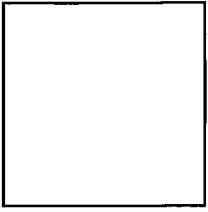

Please be advised that the Agenda for today's Council meeting does in fact have a new ordinance that might be introduced. If introduced by a member of Council, and I expect it will be, it will have 1st reading and public hearing on November 18th and 2nd Reading and public hearing on December 9th.
